Carefest is an annual community **Caretag** service day that encourages peo-



Let's show the people who want to do us harm that we are watching and reporting their activities. What does it take to become a patroller?

Attend a 2-hour training class provided by the police Patrol 1-2 hours a month

A vehicle like a car or bicycle

What is provided to our patrollers?

Broadwater Watch Identification Sign (magnetic) to attach to your vehicle while on patrol

Official "Watch" shirt, hat and safety vest

Training class

A monthly schedule for patrols (1-2 hours per month)

I have been working to update the contact information for the Neighbor Watch Roster. To our patrols who have replied to the survey – THANK YOU! To the few who have not, please reply so we can have an accurate list.

Safety Tip – Be sure to watch your speed along 37th St S as the police have been monitoring that particular route. Slow down, not just to avoid a ticket but for the safety of you and others. Cars have been clocked exceeding 100 mph and a high number exceeding 45 mph. The speed limit on our Broadwater streets is 25 mph and 15 mph in traffic calming areas.

We have very little crime to report this summer so it shows that we are being proactive and extra observant for any potential criminals looking for opportunity. Do not leave valuables in your vehicle

overnight and continue to lock your vehicles and garage door when unattended. We also ask that you do not give work to individuals that solicit door-to-door. You are taking a risk if an uninsured person is injured on your property. Report anything suspicious to the police at 893-7780 (store this number in your cell phone). Bob and Sharlet Fillingham are Broadwater Residents A Broadwater Park Committee was formed on May 7, 2018 to determine a method to measure support within the Broadwater community for an initiative, originating with some Broadwater parents, to build a playground in Broadwater. The City of St Petersburg had assessed development alternatives and indicated that the only publicly owned land available for a playground equipment was the northeast corner of Broadwater Park. The committee was charged with developing an informational presentation for a General Meeting scheduled for the evening of June 14.

The committee was co-chaired by Katy Warren, who drafted the presentation, and Jane McNeely who gave the presentation at the General Meeting. Sue Teagarden from the city's Parks and Recreation Department attended the initial meeting to provide procedural information as well as examples of playground and exercise equipment installed in other city parks. Ms. Teagarden along with her colleague, Mr. Vineyard, who attended the General Meeting, were exceptionally responsive to numerous email inquiries from committee members.

The committee researched online survey methods and ultimately chose SurveyGizmo because of its capacity for IP -based duplicate protection. The park information and survey were posted on the Broadwater website and in order to accommodate participation by as many neighbors as possible, Block Captains and committee volunteers spoke with residents when delivering the informational flyer that announced the survey, offering paper surveys if they preferred them, and collected those surveys after they were filled out.

The committee chose two questions to measure neighborhood support for the development of the playground and exercise area: Question 4 asked if the respondent or their family were likely to use the playground and exercise area, and Question 6 asked if the respondent supported the addition of the facilities to the northeast corner of the park. For both questions, survey participants were asked to rate their degree of agreement with the statement with a 5-point Likert scale from 1, "Strongly Disagree" to 5, "Strongly Agree."

Survey respondents were also asked to indicate whether they had attended the Broadwater General Meeting of June 14 or viewed the park presentation online, whether their residence was on the north side of Broadwater or the south, what method of transportation they would use to visit the playground or exercise area if they were likely to use it, and how many children and/or grandchildren were in their families. They were also asked for comments regarding their responses to item 6 about their support or non-support for the development of a playground and exercise area.

The survey period began July 7 and ended July 27 with 292 electronic responses and 8 paper copies received. The sample included 56% (N=300) of the 533 households of Broadwater. Of these 300 survey participants, 43% indicated that they live in north Broadwater (n=130), and this figure represents 65% of the 200 households that constitute north Broadwater. Of the 300 survey participants, 57% (n=170), indicated that they live in south Broadwater and this figure represents 51% of the 333 households in south Broadwater.

More than half of survey respondents (54%) indicated that they had attended the June 14 meeting or had viewed the park presentation online. Less than 1/5 (n=54, 18%) of participants reported that they have at least one child under the age of 13, and approximately one-third (n=96, 32%) reported that they have at least one grandchild under the age of 13. A majority of Broadwater residents who participated in the Broadwater Park Survey did not support adding a playground and exercise equipment to the existing park. Among survey respondents, 59% indicated that they "Strongly Disagree" or "disagree" with the statement: "My family or I are likely to use a playground or exercise area located in Broadwater Park." While 5% of respondents indicated that they were "Undecided/Neutral," 30.3% said that they "Agree" or "Strongly Agree" with this statement (see table below).

In response to the item asking them to indicate their agreement or disagreement with the statement, "I am in favor of asking the city to use Weeki Wachee funds to add a playground, exercise area, and up to five parking spaces in the northeast corner of the park," 59.4% of survey respondents indicated that they "Strongly Disagree" or "Disagree," 5% indicated that they were "Undecided/Neutral," and 35.7% indicated that they "Strongly Agree" or "Agree."

The survey also invited participants to provide comments about their responses to item 6. Most comments from those opposing the playground and exercise area centered on maintaining a green space, proximity to neighbors' yards, traffic problems (including pedestrian safety), parking issues, potential for behavior problems in the park, and consideration for the opposition expressed by neighbors adjacent to the park.

Most comments from those supporting the playground and exercise zone proposal centered on the value of adding a family-friendly amenity for our neighborhood to under-utilized land, the opportunity for enjoying recreation with neighbors, increase in human presence as a deterrent to misbehavior in the space, and the health benefits of physical play and exercise for adults and children.

Sprinklers & Lawns

My family and I bought a house in Broadwater right before the rainy season in May of 2017. My wife and I have participated in almost all the City of St Pete's water conservation programs. Having moved from old northeast where we had about 20 SF of grass to a sizable corner lot here in Broadwater, we wanted to get a

good picture of the current water consumption by participating in the City's Sensible Sprinkler Program.

While everyone in the neighborhood benefits from the reduced costs of reclaimed water in the neighborhood, our main goal is to cut back on water consumption and eventually replace most of the thirsty turf with Florida friendly landscaping. While I'm disappointed that the city has dumped so much untreated or under-treated sewage in the bay, I believe we all need to do our part to keep our bay clean. For me that starts with reducing the demand placed on the systems from my own consumption.

To participate in the Sensible Sprinkler Program, you must fill out an application and then make an appointment. They will evaluate your system, provide schematics on the layout of the existing system, recommend adjustments down to individual sprinkler heads, and best of all they will install a wireless rain gauge that acts as a shut off value when full. This free rain gauge alone is a great value, but the detailed plan will help guide you on other adjustments and configurations that will also pay off over time. MARKET MUSINGS

Broadwater waterfront sales are up this year, 16 year to date, compared to 11 for the same period last year, an increase of 45%. One sale this year was a short sale. The average size is similar, 2,350 sq ft this year vs 2,319 sq ft last year.

Average price per square foot is the same, \$287/sq ft; this year it ranged from \$230/sf to \$381/sf, the highest being our listing at 4364 40th St S which went to contract in less than a week, with multiple offers. Average price this year is \$660,219, up slightly from \$646,834 for the same period last year. Average days to contract dropped from 98 to 88. As in so much of St Pete, inventory is down, with only 2 active listings and 3 with contracts pending as of press time.

Broadwater non-waterfront sales are down slightly this year, from 10 to 9. Average size has also dropped, from 2,155 sq ft to 1,981 sq ft.

There were two sales of bank owned properties. There has been a slight increase in \$/sq ft from \$155 to \$158. The range this year was from \$110/sq ft to \$222/sq ft. Average price this year is \$348,944 compared to \$327,064 last year. There are no active listings and only one under contract - a definite lack of inventory!




What Can I Do to Help? Here are just a few suggestions: Recycle, recycle, recycle!

- Stop using straws and unnecessary convenience items especially those that are not recyclable.
- Support the national and local organizations like Ocean Conservancy, 4Ocean (selling bracelets for the cause), Tampa Bay Watch and others!
- Pick one day out of the month or even quarter to pick up some extra trash from the neighborhood or from our waterways. Many of us boat, walk, kayak and take other pleasure trips around our neighborhood, and all it takes is some extra attention and a bucket or spare bag we pick up along the way to do some good work!
- Secure trash in your boat for proper disposal and throw away your used fishing line in the monotubes available around Tampa Bay. Tampa Bay Watch staff and volunteers remove and recycle an estimated 50,000 feet of fishing line per year.

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
