RESIDENTIAL TRASH & RECYCLING

Find your recycling day and check if an item is recyclable at stpete.org/recycling or in the St. Pete Collects app.

RECYCLING COLLECTION

WHAT TO RECYCLE:

- Aluminum and steel cans and lids
- Cardboard
- Glass containers
- Milk and juice cartons, drink boxes
- · Paper, newspapers, magazines, mail, shopping ads
- Plastics #1-7
- Plastic bottles and caps

WHAT NOT TO RECYCLE:

- Ceramics
- Electronics
- Flimsy plastic
- Food-tainted items
- Garbage, food waste and liquids
- Lightbulbs, batteries
- Mirrors
- Plastic bags and wrap
- Styrofoam
- Yard waste

Place your recycling cart out by 7 a.m. on your scheduled pick up day. If you need a recycling cart or would like to request an additional cart, call the Sanitation Department at 727-893-7838.

BRUSH SITES

City residents are welcome to drop off yard waste and other organic byproducts, along with selected recyclable materials, for free at the City's brush sites.

Open 9 a.m.-5:30 p.m., 7 days a week. Closed Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

TRASH COLLECTION

Use the City-provided alley or curbside trash container to dispose of normal household waste and kitchen trash. Allow fireplace ashes to cool completely before placing in container..

WHAT NOT TO THROW AWAY:

- Appliances
- Building materials
- Furniture
- Hazardous materials (lead acid batteries, pesticides, paint, household chemicals and electronics, etc.). Find more information under "Hazardous Chemicals"
- Large carpet pieces
- Tree limbs more than 3 inches in diameter or 4 feet in length

Place your 90-gallon container within 2 feet of the curb with the lid opening toward the street by 7 a.m. on your collection day and remove it by 7 p.m. that evening. Container lid must be closed and not overloaded. Do not block the container.

SPECIAL PICK-UP

The City will pick up the following items for free, based on size and quantity. Large quantities of accumulated waste, building materials and brush may have an associated fee per cubic yard. Find current rate at stpete.org/specialpickup

WHAT'S WITH THE WOOD?

You may have gotten sticker shock if you've bought wood lately. In February, lumber prices topped \$1,000 per thousand board feet, an industry record high price. The pandemic brought a perfect storm - as states issued lockdowns in the spring of 2020, sawmills across the U.S. closed, resulting in a short supply. But at the same time, people took advantage of quarantine time to tackle home remodeling or repair projects, causing an unusually high demand.

There was a correction in the fall, but then the spike in COVID cases at the end of the year caused slowdowns in production again. The price increase in lumber has correlated directly to home construction. According to NAHB, current lumber prices are adding \$24,000 to the price tag of a typical new single-family home. That in turn adds to the shortage of inventory that is causing resale prices to skyrocket.

MARKET MUSINGS...

I don't remember a time when there were no active listings and no pending listings in Broadwater - and that applies to both waterfront and non-waterfront homes! You can't have much lower inventory than that!

Waterfront homes have had an average of 35 days from listing to contract; non-waterfront homes also averaged 35 days. Five waterfront homes and one non-waterfront home sold in 0-1 days. Waterfront homes sold at an average of 98% of their last list price and 96% of their original list price. Five of the homes sold at or above the listing price. Non-waterfront homes sold at an average of 99% of their last list price (ranging from 86% to 114%) and 97% of their original list price.

Broadwater is the only waterfront neighborhood on the included table that has nothing for sale. In all, there are less than half the supply of waterfront homes as a year ago. You can see that the average price of a Broadwater waterfront home has increased from \$788,905 in 2020 to \$1,100,200 so far this year, an increase of 39%. Non-waterfront B r o a d w a t e r average has gone from \$412,641 to 538,750, an increase of 31%.

In April there were 49 waterfront (navigable out to open water) sales in the area that I analyze in south Pinellas County, selling at an average of \$1,702,048. They averaged 26 days from listing to contract, and sold from 85% to 119% of last listing price. 40 homes went to contract, at an average listing price of \$1,653,32 with an average time of 16 days from listing to contract. 39 homes came on the market, at an average price of \$1,258,590.

For a seller, this market means you should fully prepare your house before putting it on the market - make those small repairs, repaint, freshen




FAMILIES OF BROADWATER


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Help Keep Debris Out of Our Waters


